Learning & Skills Teachers are responsible for planning and delivering learning that is current, relevant, challenging, and that inspires learners to engage and achieve their full potential. Learning & Skills Teachers collaborate closely with colleagues and other Education and Training Sector (ETS) professionals in supporting learner progress. Learning & Skills Teachers ensure the physical, psychological, and social wellbeing of learners.

GATEWAY

The gateway meeting is a milestone in the learner journey as it marks the end of the on-programme learning. The learner, employer and Skills Coach will meet and agree that the learner meets the requirements of the standard and are ready for the end point assessment.

END POINT ASSESSMENT

The end point assessment will be completed by an end point assessor from an EPA Organisation.

Professional Discussion informed by:

Thematic Case-Study

- Mapped to the relevant knowledge, skills, and behaviours across the assessment themes which will be independent evaluated with questions prepared for the subsequent professional discussion
- The learner's narrative should demonstrate proficiency in English with competence to support vocational learners' English language skills development

On-line Presentation

- Prepare and submit a 20 minute on-line presentation demonstrating their journey towards their mastery of current technologies
- The topic to be presented will be their explanation of, 'How I have developed my use of mobile and digital technologies to support teaching, learning, and learning support, during the last 2 years'.

Teaching Observations

- Two observed teaching sessions (60-minutes per observation) followed by a 20-minute Q&A session
